HOW TALL WILL YOUR SUNFLOWER GROW?

We have a stock of sunflower seeds available for collection, please email clerk@ufford-pc.gov.uk to arrange collection or delivery.

Once you have your seeds, fill a small plant pot with compost and two or three seeds, cover with a little extra compost and water. Place on a sunny windowsill and water regularly. You should see the seedling appear in about a week. When the plant is too big for the pot, move it outdoors into a larger flowerpot or sunny spot in your garden.

Watch your sunflower grow and bloom and send in your photo and a note of the height of your flower to win a prize.



MAKE A SMALL INSECT-FRIENDLY WILDLIFE GARDEN (APPROX 1M²)

Have a go at creating an insect friendly habitat in a corner of your garden. There are lots of examples online of bug hotels and wildflower areas. You could start by building a small log pile, sowing wildflower seeds or planting scabious or lavender.

Take some photos of your wildlife area for the chance to win a prize. If you are able to get photos of insects in action, even better!
